Community Asset Transfer – Market Place Primary School

As you may have seen, our appeal of Aberdeenshire Council's decision to refuse our request for an asset transfer of Market Place Primary School has been rejected, with the appeal panel opting to uphold the original decision.

The Board of The Garioch
Partnership met and after some
deliberation decided to continue
with the appeals process, after a revisit of the site.



Our appeal to the Scottish Ministers, under Section 88 of the Community Empowerment Act (2015) was submitted on Tuesday, 19th February.

The appeal may be reviewed by a written submission; a site visit; or a full hearing session. We will keep you informed as to how the appeal is progressing.

The Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) have announced a new online application process for applying to become a charity. On their web page (www.oscr.org.uk/becoming-a-charity/how-to-apply/) there is now the option to apply using the new online application process.



However, from 1 April 2019 they will withdraw the pdf application form. They know that some potential applicants and advisors will have applications in progress using the pdf form, and will continue to accept these applications until 30 April 2019.

From 01 May 2019 all incoming applications for charitable status must be submitted using the online process.

Fly Cup calls for support for stained glass entrance transformation project

Fly Cup is calling on the local community to support the transformation of its coffee shop entrance to raise funds for the organisation. The entrance to Fly Cup's coffee shop will be installed with stained glass which has been designed by local artist Roselyne O'Neill and the panels portray cupcakes, tea cups, teapots, pathways and the spectacular Bennachie.

This is one of the organisation's biggest fundraising projects and individuals and businesses are being urged to support it. A side panel is priced at £250 per piece, with a top piece costing £100 and all supporters' names will be engraved on a plaque and promoted on the organisation's website and on social media.

Chairperson at Fly Cup Catering, Fiona Allan said: "We invite the local community, both individuals and businesses, to get behind Fly Cup to see this stained glass entrance project come to fruition. We are excited to see the entrance be transformed with the unique design whilst raising vital funds to provide more opportunities for adults with learning disabilities and make improvements to our facilities."

Moving on up at Fly Cup

It is a new year and Fly Cup Catering in Inverurie is kicking off 2019 by exploring some exciting growth opportunities for the charity and the local community.

Fly Cup, on Burghmuir Circle in Inverurie, is a local charity which supports adults with learning disabilities (trainees) to learn life and employability skills through training and working in its coffee shop, kitchen, bakery and meeting rooms in addition to delivering an external catering service.

Fly Cup started the new year by launching a feasibility study to consult with the local community on opportunities to be contemplated as part of its growth plans. Among the ideas are an extension of opening hours (both early and later opening times), menu changes and offering some training courses from its extensive portfolio to members of the public and external organisations.



Bookings for Fly Cup's recently refurbished multi-purpose meeting space are also booming and a great income generator and consideration is being made to also open on Sundays to welcome more business.

The charity is progressing well towards its aim of becoming an SQA accredited centre to deliver SVQ's in

professional cookery, hospitality services, personal development and administration recognised at a national level. This will aim to enhance the experience and more importantly—the choice—for Fly Cup trainees through an accredited training and practical skills development journey.

Fiona Allan, Chairperson of Fly Cup Catering said: "We are reviewing all of the opportunities open to Fly Cup to offer more choice and variety for the local community in addition to supporting current and future trainees and generating more income for the charity to support the work we do.

"Our Board and staff team are very much looking forward to the challenge of expanding our business while still remaining true to our main aim of supporting adults with learning disabilities."



CIG Updates



Logie Durno Hall

The hall committee received £750 to replace fascias. The gutters, soffits and downpipes were all replaced and have made a difference to the hall/

Everything also looks much better as the external doors were painted to match in with the black gutters etc., so it all looks much more together.

The Treatment Room

A grant of £638.48 was used for start-up costs for the Steps Into Wellness group.

They now have a laptop and office software, which is used to produce publicity information, develop funding bids, collate information on activities and access information online.





They also purchased a community noticeboard, enabling people to see what is happening without the need for online access and increases awareness of their presence in the community.

TGP have also been assisting with support for further funding bids, generating confidence to approach funders and giving an understanding of how to present the work they are doing.



Our Grants are reviewed by a panel of independent volunteers. In 2017/18 they offered their opinions on 21 grant applications, totalling £15,465.

Garidge Theatre

The Garidge Theatre were awarded a Community Initiative Grant of £540 in Spring 2018.





Some of it was spent on a Flashmob in Inverurie in June, taking place in the town in various places, including in the middle of Tesco.

Many young people and adults took part, with excellent feedback on the event.

The rest has been spent on workshops with writer Alan Bissett, which has been towards possibly creating a new piece on an Inverurie topic.



Alan delivered 7 hours of workshops, which was greatly inspiring, leading to much discussion and a real buzz among the young people who took part.

Kembhill Park Flood Group

KPFG were set up following the flooding caused by Storm Frank in January 2016.

They were awarded £750 from the Community Initiative Grant fund in January 2017.

The grant was used to purchase a range of equipment for use by KPFG volunteers, should there be the risk of a repeat of the flooding event experienced in January 2016.





The equipment purchased included:

- Water absorbing and self-expanding Hydro Snake flood bags and Hydro Sacks, (to be used where required to give added protection within our community).
- Two pairs of Walkie-Talkie Radio Sets for communication during a barrier deployment. This also provides an additional option should there be a loss of phone networks.
- High-Visibility Vests, a Waterproof First Aid Kit, PVC Gloves, Head Torches and Wind-up Torches to provide a level of safety for KPFG volunteers.
- An additional Output Hose, Hose Connectors, 5 Litre and 20 Litre Diesel Fuel Containers for use with the KPFG Portable Water Pump.
- A 24 Litre PVC Kit Bag, zip-seal bags to provide waterproof protection and Dehumidifier containers to reduce moisture in storage areas.

Aberdeenshire Council have purchased 13 sections of Watergate Temporary Flood Barrier, which are now stored at their facilities in Kemnay. They have also appointed a contractor to manage the deployment of the Temporary Flood Barrier. The contractor will also provide emergency lighting and water pumps.

In November 2018 KPFG members, along with Aberdeenshire Council Emergency Planning Officers observed



an exercise by the appointed Contactor. The exercise included a full emergency barrier deployment including emergency water pumps within the community.

It was a successful exercise and should give residents some reassurance that we have a level of protection against a potential flood event.

Resilience / Flood Recovery Grants


Following the flooding that hit the Garioch area in January 2016, the Inverurie Round Table set up a campaign to raise funds for those who had been affected.

Vattenfall

Vattenfall have committed to annually investing £150,000 to a community benefit scheme for the 20 year lifetime of the European Offshore Wind Deployment Centre, in Aberdeen Bay.



Applications to the Unlock our Future Fund opened on 14th January 2019 and close on **15th April 2019**. Application forms are available at the Unlock our Future Fund webpage. It is expected that the successful applicants will receive their funding award in early Summer 2019.

Following an extensive community consultation the fund priorities were decided and the boundaries of the Fund established. Any constituted organisation or community group in Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire is eligible to apply. The feedback from community members across the City and Shire was that this should be a different fund that should make a real difference to communities across the region.

There are four key priorities of the scheme and each application must demonstrate how it will meet **all four** of these priorities outlined below. To be eligible for funding from the Unlock our Future Fund, each application must:

- Contribute to a climate smarter world with sustainability at its core
- Invest in community facilities and/or activities that are fit for the future
- Be innovative
- Ensure a legacy and lasting impact which clearly brings benefit to the local community.

In Summer 2018, an independent community champions panel was appointed to shape the Fund, the strategy, the application process and to select the successful applications. This panel appointed Foundation Scotland as the administrator of the Fund.


