Foundation Scotland's **Baillie Gillford Community Fund** remains open!

The National Lottery Community Fund

**M&S** is kickstarting the 'Neighbourly Community Fund' specifically to support those most impacted by COVID-19. The whole M&S family – including M&S Bank and M&S Energy – is supporting the fund, which will help mobilise more than 1000 local charities to support the most vulnerable members of our communities immediately. Alongside this local on-the-ground funding M&S is supporting the National Emergencies Trust Campaign with a donation to help galvanize the national efforts now under way. This means M&S will continue to donate to these funds every time you use your Sparks card.

The Wellbeing Fund has been launched by the Scottish Government to support organisations across the 3rd Sector that are providing important services for people as a result of COVID-19. More information can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

**The Shared Breaks – Creative Breaks** fund is now open! The fund provides 12 month grants to 3rd Sector Organisations to develop and deliver short break projects and services for carers of adults (aged 21 and over) and young carers (caring for children or adults), and the people they care for. • **Funding for creative sector during Covid-19:** Creative Scotland has launched three new funds to support the creative sector during this period:

<u>Creative Scotland Bridging Bursary Fund</u> – To help sustain creative practice by freelance creative professionals who have lost earnings due to the cancelation of work as a result of COVID-19.

<u>Screen Scotland Bridging Bursary Fund</u> – To provide similar one-off bursary support to self-employed screen sector workers

Open Fund: Sustaining Creative Development – To provide support for individuals and organisation

# COVIC-19 Funding assistance

STV has launched its Local Lifeline initiative, an extension of STV's successful Growth Fund, which will support local businesses and charities impacted by the pandemic by providing free on-air and online advertising.

Building Futures Persimmon's Charitable Foundation has this week committed to relaunching its Building Futures scheme for 2020. As part of its sponsorship of Team GB, Persimmon will donate more than £1 million to support children in sport, health and education. They are calling on local groups within the area which support children to apply. It can all be done online remotely atwww.persimmonhomes.com/building-futures.

Community Champions. Persimmon's Community Champions initiative has run since 2015 and gives away £64,000 every month in single donations up to the value of £1,000. So far over £3.5 million has been donated in the UK. Persimmon has decided that from April 2020 all funding will go directly to groups supporting the over 70s.However, they need your help to find these groups. Standard Life Foundation — Fast Track Applications

Standard Life Foundation are making funding available for work directly related to the pandemic, addressing specific challenges and helping to contribute to social change which tackles financial problems and improves living standards for those on low-to-middle incomes in the UK.

**Leathersellers' Company Charitable Fund.** The Leathersellers' Company has launched a fast track application process for one-off grants of up to £3,000. It could be particularly useful for funding small projects or to cover unexpected costs arising from COVID-19. Applications are open to UK registered charities who support: – the homeless or those at risk of becoming homeless; – provision of food and essential supplies; – victims of domestic violence; – nursing care to vulnerable patients.

Barclays COVID19 Community Aid. Barclays have announced a £100m 'Covid-19 Community Aid package' to be distributed through the newly established Barclays Foundation. £50m will be donated to charities working to support vulnerable people impacted by Covid-19 and up to £50m will be in the form of matching personal donations made by Barclays' staff to local charities.

Resilience & Recovery Loan Fund – Big Society Capital/Social Investment Business The Resilience and Recovery Loan Fund, which will make more than £100m in loans and investments available to charities and social enterprises over the coming months. The fund, which is likely to open for applications mid-April, aims to support organisations which may not qualify for other government funding schemes, but which are seeing their trading and cash flow disrupted by coronavirus. **Celebrate Aberdeen** have <u>announced</u> that those that took part in the 2019 parade can apply to a £1500 funding pot.

**Bank of Scotland Foundation** is expanding its Reach programme, offering application phases on a monthly basis and wider eligibility. Grants of between £5000 and £30 000 are available if turnover is less than £1.5m.


