Hello, and welcome to the Garioch Gazette



Apologies if you were expecting an issue in October – we decided to hold back so that we could feature our Winter Forum.

Brought forward to try to avoid the worst of the winter weather, our Winter Forum was held on a cold and wet November evening. There was a warm welcome inside Fly Cup though, plus a fine piece to keep the spirits up and entertainment from Valerie Chapman to welcome everyone.

Our Chairman, John Chapman, led a brief EGM and gave an update on the Partnership and the Community Asset Transfer. Dawn gave an update on the recent Democracy Matters Conversations. We also heard from representatives from for the Love of Garioch and Ury Riverside Park. See inside for more information.



Dawn also presented a cheque to some of the groups who have received Community Initiative or Resilience Fund Grants so far in 2018/19.

The combined total of grants awarded was £4,921.20.

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EGM & Winter Forum

John explained that the brief EGM was necessary as the Accounts, which had not been examined at the time of the 2018 AGM, have now been completed and signed off by the accountant. She has now done the accounts for two years and is willing to stay on, which should make the process quicker next year.



We ended the financial year with a small surplus as expected from the AGM. We do maintain reserves; having a duty of care to two employees. The accounts can be downloaded from the website. We also hold funds on behalf of other groups, including those just setting up who have no access to a bank account: TGP act as a holding account on their behalf. Eventually, these funds will be passed to the groups. The Trustee's Annual Report has been submitted to, and accepted by, OSCR.



John also had to report that two of our board members have stood down due to work and time commitments.

Kay Diack and Graham Geddes had been with TGP from before Day 1, as both were on the steering group prior to the Partnership being set up.



John gave huge thanks to both of them, for the sterling work and effort that they have put into the Partnership. They will be missed but, fortunately, they will both remain with the Partnership, as representatives of member groups.

This does mean that we are on the lookout for new trustees. Fiona Cooper was elected to the board at the EGM, and we look forward to working with her, but there is space for more!

Community Asset Transfer

The Partnership's request for an asset transfer of Market Place Primary School was rejected by the Garioch Area Committee at the end of August.

We have since put in an appeal of that decision, which will be reviewed at the end of November by a different panel.



We feel that we've had a lot of support for our plans, from the business community, community groups, community council etc. and we intend to pursue the asset transfer as far as we can, although we recognise that it may take some time. We will keep you posted, and it will likely be in the press too.

When asked what happens if the appeal is rejected, John explained that the next stage would be to appeal to the Scottish Government. John added that our original plans for the asset transfer were submitted before the Council released their Strategic Plan, and also pointed out that we could have been in the building over a year ago, as we did offer to take on a short-term lease, paying the business rates for the building but the council refused.

TGP will keep persevering and hopefully will come out with a community hub.

Our revenue grant has decreased and the hub would help us to generate income and hopefully allow us to expand our staffing, with the aim of having 2-3 development workers covering Garioch. We will pursue this as far as we can.

Democracy Matters

Dawn reported on the Democracy Matters Conversations that she has hosted across Garioch recently, and thanked all who took part.

Conversations were hosted in Newmachar, Inverurie, Westhill, Kemnay and Kintore, as well as with groups at Grampian Opportunities and Syrian New Scots.

The key points raised across the conversations included space, services, bus routes and broadband, so no real surprises. What was clear is that people in our local area feel that democracy matters.

What was interesting is that TGP were the first group in Scotland to request materials in Arabic, in order to work with the Syrian New Scots.

tt-exchange

John pointed out that, following our tech update funded by Awards for All last year, we have been able to get Office 365 for free by registering as a charity with TT Exchange, and he encouraged others to look into this.

This group of volunteers have been carrying out a variety of tasks, including doing people's gardens; helping people move house; visiting people and organising entertainment. The aim is to target those who are lonely.

They are currently organising their Christmas event: a community lunch, with an open invitation for anyone who is lonely or struggling financially to come down for Christmas lunch. Having had 25 people at an event organised last year, with the help of a local church; this year they are expanding and expecting around 80 people to attend.

Food has been donated; the Town Hall is being provided free of charge by the council as a venue, and Premier Coaches have offered to provide transport on the day. Now they are trying to spread the word far and wide, and they are hoping that TGP member groups will help. Following the Christmas Lunch, once they have an idea of who is out there, they may hope to organise local minigroups to help reduce isolation and loneliness in Garioch.

OSCR Scottish Charity Regulator

HAVE YOU CONTACTED OSCR?

Charity trustees must seek prior consent from OSCR:

- before changing the name of the charity
- before amending the objects or purposes of the charity
- before amalgamating the charity with another body
- before winding-up the charity or dissolving a SCIO
- before converting a Company or Community Benefit Society to a SCIO
- before applying to the court to change purposes, amalgamate, or wind-up.

Prior consent must be sought at least 42 days in advance of the proposed change taking effect.

OSCR must be notified no later than 3 months after the following changes have taken effect:

- as soon as the Principal Contact changes*
- when the contact details for the existing Principal Contact change*
- when the accounting year end date has changed*
- when changes unrelated to purposes are made to the constitution
- when any change consented to by OSCR is implemented.

*Please notify us of these changes by updating your charity's details using our OSCR Online Service found via www.oscr.org.uk

You must also notify us no later than one month of the following changes taking effect:

- any administration order or an order for winding-up a charity made by the court
- the appointment of a receiver.

REMEMBER!

- Contact OSCR as soon as your Principal Contact details change.
- Make sure that your charity's annual accounts are returned to OSCR with your completed Annual Return no later than 9 months after the charity's financial year end.
- Notifications and Applications for Consent should be made in writing and sent to OSCR. This can be done by email.
- Application Forms (for consent) and Notification Forms (for notification) can be downloaded from the OSCR website at www.oscr.org.uk. Hard copies are also available on request.
- You do not have to notify OSCR every time your charity trustees change unless the change is your Principal Contact.

Kemnay Breakfast and After School Club



Kemnay Breakfast and After School Club received funding to update and replace the staff uniform. The staff of the club, which has been running for over 20 years, currently wear uniforms with different logos and different shades of colour, dependant on age of the items.

The staff have voted to keep the current logo, which is one designed by previous children who attended the club, however, the design will be expanded so that it can be used online and in print.

They are in the process of getting this replaced.



Al Amal - Round the Kitchen Table Project

Hospitality is at the very core of Arabic culture and New Scots families had already hosted several meals at several locations throughout Aberdeenshire, however although these events were great fun and well attended by Scottish families, they had not had any noticeable impact on creating long term friendships.

This, coupled with awareness of two facts - 1. Arabic women did not relax in the presence of Scots men and 2. the Scots were anxious about interacting because of a lack of awareness of Arabic customs and social norms, led to the suggestion of holding some small 'same sex' events before coming together for a celebratory meal.

Large platters for sharing food are essential household items in the New Scots households and this sparked the idea of offering a pottery workshop to the women; the fact that there were a few 'ex' chefs amongst the New Scots families the idea of offering a bread making workshop for men.

2 pottery workshops were held at the Garioch Community Centre in Inverurie and it was wonderful to see 5 Syrian and 5 Scottish women working together to follow the tutors instructions - sharing clay and rolling pins and helping one another make decisions about the size and designs of their plates.





6 Scottish and 6 Syrian men attended a bourk (Syrian pastry) making demonstration on the 26th June at the Garioch Community Kitchen.

The Syrian men deftly changed bowls of dry ingredients into dough by adding water and oil and great fun was had when everyone was given the opportunity to knead it, roll it out and cut it into small circles.

The fillings were mixed and added and then, when they were in the oven baking, the men sat around the kitchen table chatting. The 'Round the Kitchen Table' Meal was held at Port Elphinstone Community House on June 28th.

The CLD Workers had set up a photographic display from the two workshops and a display of the completed pottery to encourage folk to mix and mingle.



30 people of wide range of ages (from primary school to retired) attended and enjoyed good food and fine company. The event was due to run from 7 – 9pm but people stayed well beyond finishing time, chatting and eating.

Friendships were definitely cemented over the four events. The events allowed the Scots to approach their Syrian neighbours in the confidence that they would be acknowledged. Stories are now emerging of folk waving from buses to one another and saying hello in shops and on the street.



Building trust when you don't speak the same language is a slow process, but a fun environment with shared activity eases any anxieties. Some of the original Port Elphinstone residents are now the biggest advocates of integration in Aberdeenshire. 'You jist have to get o'yoursel and be friendly. It disnae take a lot.'

Greener Kemnay

Greener Kemnay held an open day at the Birley Bush Community Garden in Kemnay, on Saturday 8th September. Over 160 people visited the garden and took part in various activities, including rock painting, decorating paving stones.

Following a year of extreme weather, from snow and ice in February and March, through the dry, hot summer, the garden was full of colour and local produce.

Visitors also had the opportunity to learn about what else is happening around Kemnay, from representatives of Kemnay Bee Group, Save Bennachie, The Youth Forum and the Community Development team.



Attendees could also collect a Hedgehog Hustle checklist – with 72 hedgehogs on display throughout the village.

Inverurie Music

19 participants (one sextet, one quintet, and two quartets) attended Kemnay Church Centre for the day and were tutored by Jean Fletcher and Gareth John.

Four people were on a reserve list. The Kemnay Church Centre proved an excellent venue. Thank you again for assisting with this.

Further workshops are *en train* or have happened *viz,* a cello masterclass and a guitar masterclass on 23rd Sept with 14 participants and tutoring by two professors from the Royal Scottish Conservatoire and Ivan Ilic, classical pianist, in November. Next year two more workshops are programmed given by a visiting classical violinist. The Chamber Music Day in the spring will be with the same locally based tutors.

There's still money in the pot, although the pot is slightly smaller, as the funding for our Community Initiative Grants has been cut to £5,000 for 2018/19.

This does mean that we will not be able to fund as many projects this year – so if you have a project in mind - get your applications in soon!





Resilience / Flood Recovery
